If you are unfamiliar, it allows you to honor a fallen comrade or loved one with a Scholarship in their honor for an individual contribution of \$500 to the "Chappie" Hall Trust. Your contribution will be matched by a minimum of \$500 from the trust to make each scholarship a minimum of \$1000 each. There may be a limited number of these available each year, so if you wish to donate to the next year's awards, please contact the Association Finance Administrator at our Fort Campbell office.

**Scholarship Application Instructions**  
Read and Understand All instructions Before Completing The Application.

### Objective

The objective of the 101st Airborne Division Association and Screaming Eagle Foundation's scholarship program is to provide financial assistance to students who have the potential to become assets to our nation.

The major factors to be considered in the evaluation and rating of applicants are eligibility, career objectives, academic record, and insight gained from the letter requesting consideration and letters of recommendation.

AI & Willamary Viste Applicants - Preference will be given, but is not limited, to obtaining a degree in one of the physical sciences, medical or scientific research field.

### Eligibility

- Applicant's parents, grandparents, husband or wife is (or if deceased, was) a regular or life member (not an associate member) of the 101st Airborne Division Association.
- Chappie Hall Scholarship - Applicant must maintain a "B" or better non-weighted grade average during the past school year.
- AI & Willamary Viste Scholarship - Applicant must maintain a minimum cumulative 3.75 or better (transcript required). Applicant must be either an upper classman (3rd or 4th year) or graduate student.
- Applicants shall not be attending nor accepted as a student to the United States Military Academy, the Naval Academy or the Air Force Academy.

### Application

- Applicant must complete the Screaming Eagle Foundation, "Application for Scholarship" Form and provide all required documentation.
- If qualified, students may apply for both the Chappie Hall and AI & Willamary Viste scholarships, but will only receive one.
- Applicants may apply and receive an award each year for a maximum of four years for an undergraduate degree and two years for a graduate degree.

### Required Documentation

A checklist of documents that are required to be submitted with the applicant's application is provided on page 2 of the Application for Scholarship Form. Applications that are missing *any* of the required documents will be rejected.

### Submission

- All applications must be completed and submitted during the five-week application period. *Applications will not be accepted any reason before or after the designated application period.*
- Application Period: **April 8, 2019 thru May 24, 2019.**
- Applications must be received *no later than* close of business on Friday, May 24, 2019.

### Required Documents Checklist

A complete application **must** include **all** the following documents.

- Completed front side of form (Personal Information, Scholarship Election, School Information) .
- A "head and shoulders" photo of the applicant suitable for publication in "The Screaming Eagle" if the scholarship grant is awarded.
- Proof of Membership of parent, grandparent, husband or wife in the 101st Airborne Division Association (attach copy of membership card or other proof of membership).
- An official transcript of school records.
  - *Chappie Hall* - include as a minimum, the past school year.
  - *Al & Willamary Viste* - include all post secondary education.
- Letters of acceptance from a college or university.
- Two letters of recommendation **written within the past 6 months**. (from other than a relative).
  - *Chappie Hall* - one must be from a teacher.
  - *Al & Willamary Viste* - one must be from a college or university professor.
- A typed letter in which the applicant will briefly discuss the following subjects in addition to others he or she considers relevant (*Al & Willamary Viste* applicant must *also* give a concise statement of long-term goals, to include post graduate educational and professional aspirations, following graduation):
  - Hobbies, interests, sports and personal achievements.
  - Career objectives - near and long term.
  - Name of school, college or university applicant plans to attend and why chosen.
  - How a higher education for the applicant in his/her chosen field can benefit our nation.
  - Community Service.
- Original typed, double-spaced, essay on the indicated topic:
  - *Graduating High School Students* - "Patriotism." (Not less than 250 or more than 300 words.)
  - *Current College/University Students* - "The Importance of the U.S. Constitution." (Not less than 500 or more than 550 words.)
